You are the expert on your child! Everyone on the individualized education program (IEP) team brings knowledge and expertise to help develop a high-quality IEP that meets your child’s needs. The information you share is critical. When completing this information, consider:

- reviewing your child’s past IEP, progress toward current IEP goals, and samples of schoolwork and
- asking your child about any concerns or encouraging your child to complete the *Student Form for Preparing for the IEP Team Meeting*.
